Why do we have uniform expectations?

1. Students are all equal in the school grounds.
2. Workplace Health and Safety requirements.
3. Students are identifiable as a Trinity student and a valued part of our College community.
4. Prepare students for the workplace.



Hats

All students are required to wear the formal school hat when outdoors, even if in a shaded area or undercover.



College Backpack

Students must have a Trinity backpack for school.



Formal Shoes

Students are required to wear with their formal uniform **black leather lace-up**.

There must be a **distinct heel** on the shoe.



Sports Shoes

Students should wear a sports-specific shoe, **runners or cross-trainers** with the sports uniform and when representing the College for sport.

Shoes

Shoes with a flat sole, high tops, street or skater shoes are not suitable in a school environment due to Health and Safety concerns, due to minimal grip and/or ankle support.

Junior Formal Uniforms

Blue junior shirts are to be **tucked in** (the whole way around)
and a **black dress style belt** with grey trousers or shorts.



Junior Formal Uniforms

Plain dark dress socks are to be worn with long trousers and pants.

College Grey socks with red line visible are to be worn with shorts.

No sports socks or coloured socks.



Junior Formal Uniforms

Be mindful of the colour of undershirts etc worn under the uniform, so that these are **not visible through the school shirt.**



Junior Formal Uniforms

When wearing the blue College Skirt, students must wear the **Trinity College socks/sockettes or black stockings**.

When wearing the College long pants, dark plain socks are to be worn.

No sports socks or coloured socks.



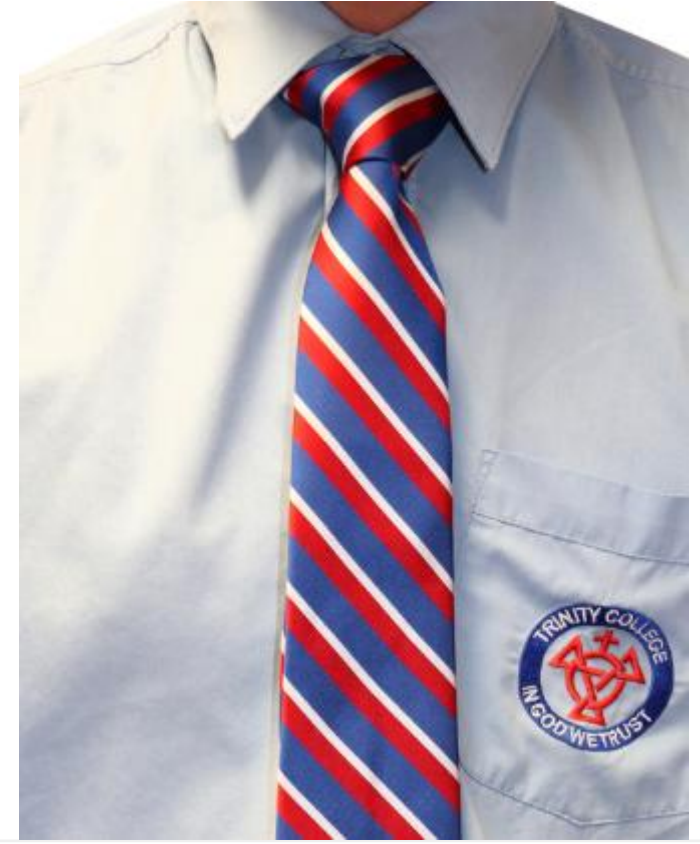
Junior Formal Uniforms

Skirts must be an appropriate length.

The junior blouse must **sit below the waistband on the skirt or pant.**

Be mindful of the colour of “undershirts” *etc* worn under the uniform, so that these are **not visible through the white blouse.**





Ties

Ties must be tied/pinned/placed to cover the top button of the shirt

Senior Formal Uniform

- When wearing the white senior shirt, must have their **shirts tucked in (the whole way around)**
- **A black dress style belt.**
- **Plain dark dress socks** are to be worn with pants and trousers. No sports socks or coloured socks.
- Be mindful of the colour of undershirts etc worn under the uniform, so that these are **not visible through the white senior shirt.**



Senior Formal Uniforms

When wearing the blue College Skirt, students must wear the **Trinity College sockettes or black stockings**.

When wearing the College long pants, plain dark socks are to be worn.

No sports socks or coloured socks.



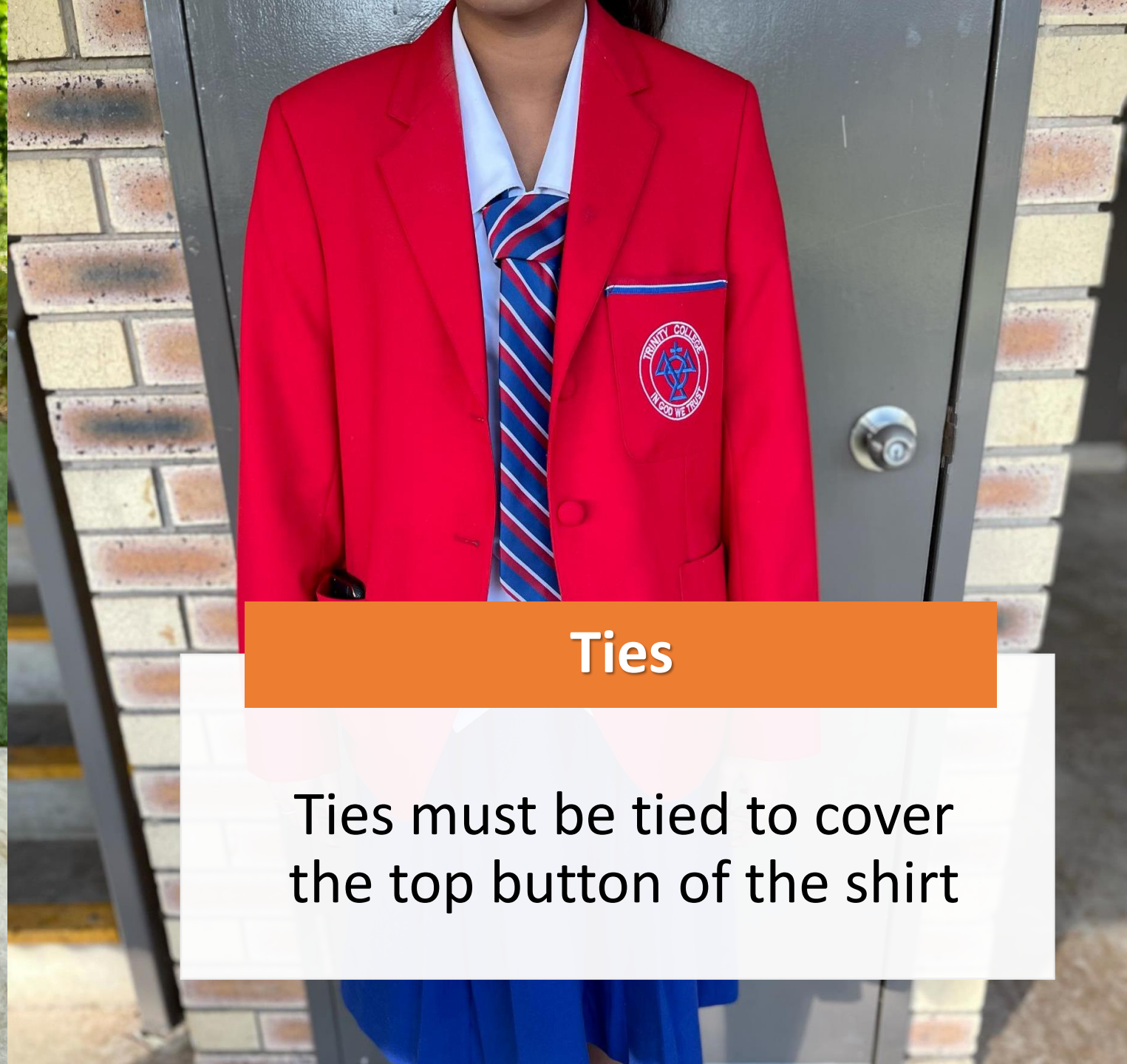
Senior Uniforms

Skirts must be an appropriate length.

Winter Uniform – Yr 12 Jersey

- Yr 12 Students are permitted to wear their Jersey under their Blazer each day.
- The only days Yr 12's cannot do this is on days when we have formal school events.



Winter Uniform

Students may wear a plain under shirt under their uniform in winter to keep warm. This needs to not be visible outside or through the uniform.

A scarf is available for students to wear during winter. No other scarves, blankets, shawls or pashminas are allowed.





Sports Uniform

Sports uniform is to be worn only as prescribed by their practical subject teachers.

On days when students have timetabled PE lessons, they will change into PE / SASD / Dance uniform at the start of the lesson and change back into full school uniform at the end of the lesson.

Students are not to come to school in their sports uniform.

Sports Uniform

The College sports hat can **only** be worn with the College Sports Uniform.

Sports Uniform

Students who are representing the College or going off-site that are not in the **complete and appropriate uniform** will not be permitted to travel or play.

Students who are representing the College on a sports tour or at a carnival must wear the **Student Representative Shirt** .



Make Up and Accessories

Glam and non-natural make up, nail polish, fake nails, fake eyelashes and eyelash extensions are not part of the school uniform.

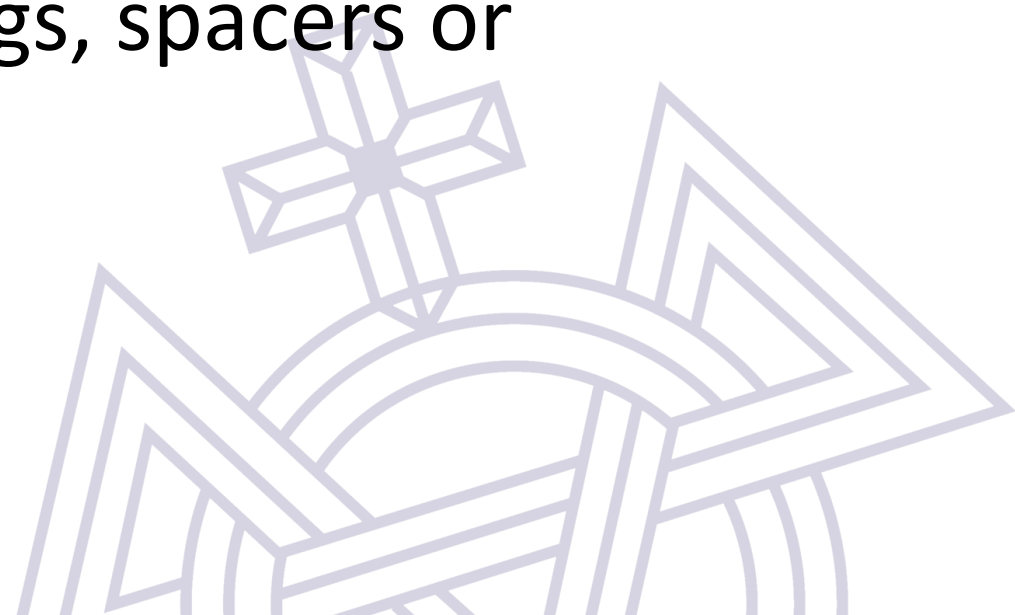
Permitted:

- A watch (smart watches are prohibited in any assessment)
- signet/plain ring
- Plain sleepers or studs in the ear are permitted. Studs may not exceed 5mm in diameter and sleepers may not extend more than 5mm from the edge of the ear and the outer edge of the sleeper.
- a small, plain, discreet, silver or gold cross, religious or cultural icon on a fine chain around the neck. Any other item of jewelry is not to be seen.
- Nose ring - 1 Plain, gold, silver or clear (no stones) stud, no greater than 1mm in diameter

Facial or Body Piercing

Observable facial or body piercing is banned.

Students are not permitted to cover any pierced objects with band aids nor are plugs, spacers or retainers acceptable.



Hair Cuts and Styles

- 1. Conservative, corporate and conform to the shape of the head.**
- 2. Excessiveness in style, colour, gel, or cut,** which the College deems as extreme, will not be tolerated.



Hair Cuts and Styles

Not permitted

- Mohawks, fauxhawks and variations
- All over crew cuts blade 1 and below
- Decorative tracks and lines
- Dreadlocks
- Visible Rat tail (or similar)
- Mulletts





Line at the part is permitted

No tracks, other lines, shaping or bordering.

Hair Cuts and Styles

Cornrows or braids are permitted when they run **uniformly from the front to the back of the head only.**

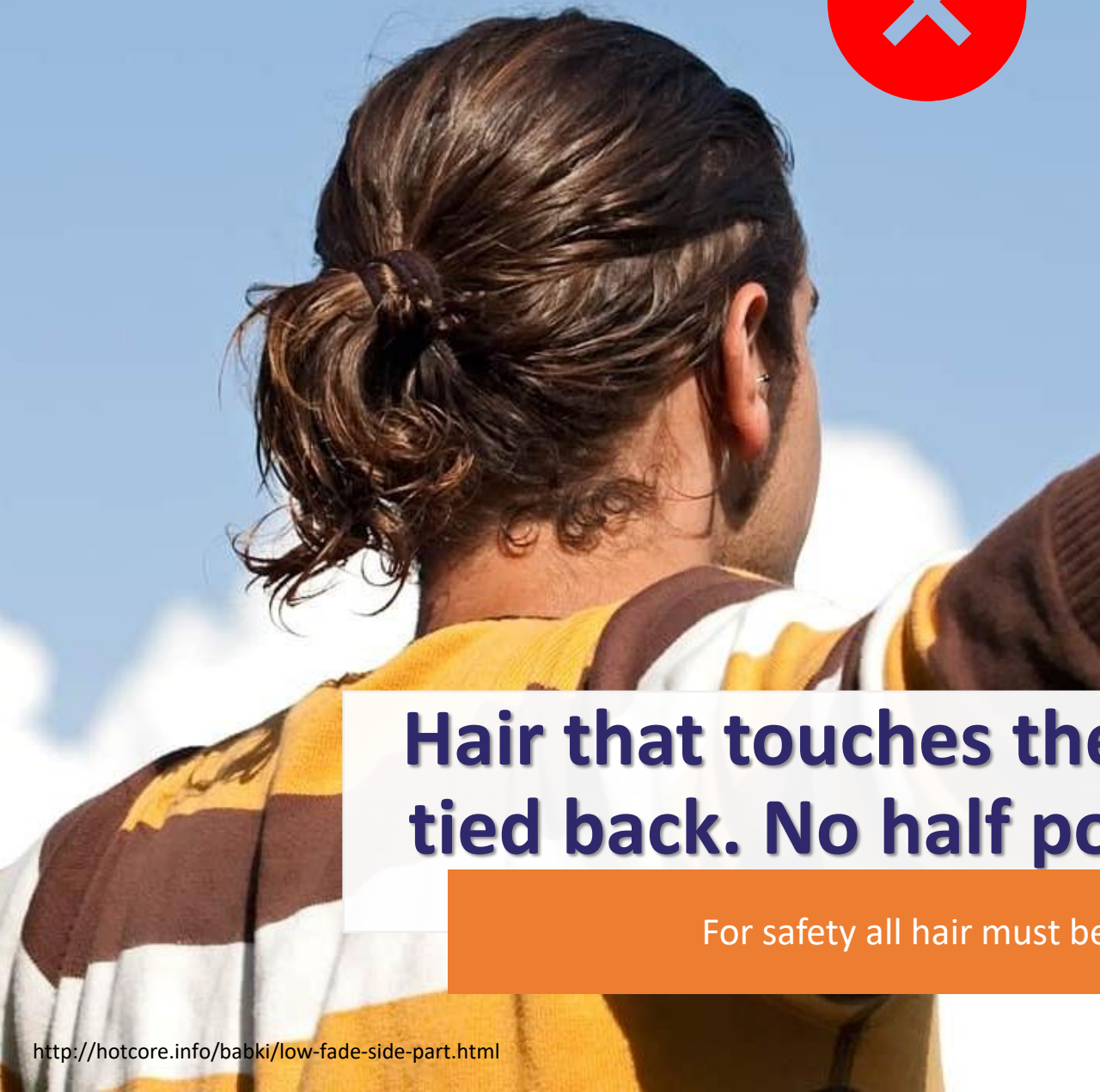
Box braids that can't be tied back or braids with an undercut are not permitted



Hair Cuts and Styles

- Students with shoulder length hair (touching the collar of the uniform) or longer are to have their hair tied back.
- Hair ties, clip and pins should be in **one of the school colours or similar to the student's natural hair colour.**





Hair that touches the collar must be fully tied back. No half ponytails or variations

For safety all hair must be tied and/or pinned back

General

Students must be clean shaven at all times.

Prescribed footwear must be worn at all times.

Tattoos are not to be visible at any time.

Any variations to the above uniform requirements need to be approved by the College Leadership Team and will be recorded in Engage.
